	 Note: The two files VEST appears to have used are "New Mexico Voting Districts (VTD) October 2021" and "New Mexico Voting Precincts 2012-2020"
Election results validated for every candidate statewide? Yes	For the precinct-level file that we were able to download, precinct vote totals that equaled less than 5 votes were obfuscated. As a result, at the statewide total level, the election results did not match VEST's. We are not sure if VEST obtained an election results file without these obfuscations or whether they allocated the votes back into the data somehow. VEST's statewide totals match those of NM's election summary report (<u>https://electionresults.sos.state.nm.us/Default.aspx?</u>), but not the exported sum of the county-level data in the notebook, due to obfuscations also present in that file.
Election results validated for every candidate by county? No	For the precinct-level file that we were able to download, precinct vote totals that equaled less than 5 votes were obfuscated. As a result, at the county total level, the election results did not match VEST's. We were able to confirm that VEST's countywide totals match those of NM's election summary report (<u>https://electionresults.sos.state.nm.us/Default.aspx?</u>) in all counties, except for those where obfuscations are present, as the summary report we where able to locate also contains obfuscations for 12 counties where presidential candidates received fewer than 5 total votes.
Election results validated for every candidate by precinct? No	At the precinct level, the election results did not match VEST's (43 out of 1917 precincts matched), there were also 8 zero-vote precincts that did not appear in VEST's file. All precinct vote differences appear to be caused by the obfuscations. Although the total number of obfuscated votes that VEST dispersed appears correct, we can not validate VEST's methodology in dispersing the obfuscated votes. The maximum difference that would be present would only be 5 votes for a particular race in a particular precinct.
