<p><b>Election results validated for every candidate statewide?</b></p> <p><b>Yes</b></p>	<p>At the statewide total level, the election results matched VEST's.</p> <p>The totals also match those of RI's statewide summary file (<a href="https://www.ri.gov/election/results/2018/general_election/">https://www.ri.gov/election/results/2018/general_election/</a>).</p>
<p><b>Election results validated for every candidate by county?</b></p> <p><b>Yes</b></p>	<p>At the county total level, the election results matched VEST's with the exception of two counties being off by 1 vote for race G18USSDWHI</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Kent has a difference of 1 (Source: 36723, VEST: 36722)</li> <li>- Providence has a difference of 1 (Source: 126733, VEST: 126734)</li> </ul> <p>The totals, however, still match up. This difference of 1 is likely a result of distributing votes on federal district level after distributing on township level - which produces more accurate precinct-by-precinct level vote allocation, but may have led to inaccurate distribution of votes on federal district level.</p> <p>RI does not have a county-level summary file to compare against.</p>
<p><b>Election results validated for every candidate by precinct?</b></p> <p><b>Yes</b></p>	<p>At the precinct level, the election results matched VEST's in 409 out of 421 precincts. Of the 12 precincts with vote differences, 11 precincts had a max vote difference of 1 and 1 precinct had a max vote difference of 2, which could be attributed to VEST's specific methodology and rounding for vote allocation.</p> <p>There were also two zero-vote precincts in VEST's file that did not appear in the election results file.</p> <p>No precinct name changes were required - precinct ID's were used.</p>
